Step 1Transposition

The MSFD was transposed into the Estonian Water Act in March 2011.

Ministry of the Environment is responsible for the implementation of the Directive.

Step 2Public Procurement

Estonia decided to make 2 separate public procurements:

one for the article 8 – for the initial assessment of the current status of marine waters;

2. for the articles 9 and 10 together – for the determination of GES of the marine waters and for the establishment of environmental targets and associated indicators **ESKKONNAMINISTEERIUM**

Step 3 Timeline

1st public procurement was to be carried out between October and December 2011.

2nd public procurement was to be carried out between April and June 2012.



Step 4Expert Team


Our team was composed of about 30 different top experts all over Estonia.
